

GA-SC Bulls Soccer Club U-11 Boys capture US Club Soccer Regional title.

The U11 Boys team made some great use of the weekend of June 27 and 28 winning the US Club Soccer Regional title. Some of the top teams from the Carolinas, Georgia, Tennessee, Virginia, Maryland, and Pennsylvania were in this Regional Cup hosted at Winston-Salem, NC.

This historic win is the GA-SC Bulls first state or regional title after a couple of teams from the fall flirted with State Cup championships at the U18 and U14 girls' levels of play.

The U11 team went a perfect 3-0 in group play to top group A and claim a spot in the Sunday finals. The team netted 24 goals in the pool play allowing just 9 goals over the three games.

A stubborn Cherokee County Impact (Atlanta) team awaited the Bulls in the final and on the strength of the Impact goalkeeper 'standing on his head' to make some spectacular saves took a 1-0 lead into the final minutes of the game. Then as time was just about to expire, Mitchell Myers hit one last shot on target that snuck over the goalkeeper's head tying the game with just seconds to play.

So on that final kick of the ball the game ended 1-1 full time and went into overtime.

After trading shots over the overtime period it looked like the Cup was going to penalty kicks to determine a winner until some more late game Bulls magic took place.

A Jacob Vaiden corner kick was whipped into the box where Trey Hammond delivered the final touch to find the nets and put the Bulls up 2-1 and capture the Cup with about a minute left in the overtime period.
